Dear Friends,

This is the first time that I've written this letter as your Associate Priest, rather than your Assistant Curate. You may have noticed in the address box at the top of this letter that I have changed my email address to reflect this. My training as a minister is now complete, but I choose to stay here and continue to serve in our parishes, where my calling has been nurtured and sustained over the last twenty years or so.

The sense of things coming to fruition is very much one for this time of year as crops ripen and we start to look to the harvest of grain and of fruit – plus lots of vegetables in our gardens too. We hope for the right sort of weather to ensure the good crops to make sure we have plenty of provision for the year ahead. We know too though that none of this is certain and across the world and increasingly here too, many people struggle to make ends meet.

This month is also the one when students often receive exam results and find out whether their hopes for the future are going to be realised or whether some tweaks will have to be made in their expectations.

It is easy, and understandable, to find oneself disheartened - even overwhelmed - when things don't go to plan and one has to change one's dearly held plans.

Maybe a thought that St Luke puts into the mouth of Jesus can offer a useful piece of wisdom to us at such times:

"Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life?"

Worrying too much can be very destructive – and actually be an obstacle to finding ways through disappointments and challenges. We are fortunate in this area that there are many sources of help and support available, often made possible by the generosity of local people with their own time, expertise and resources. You will be able to find evidence of such groups and organisations in the pages of the Honeypot.



But at this moment, sitting in the garden with the sun shining, I pray that we may all have a chance to enjoy summer in its all too brief appearance.


### **Rushbury and Cardington Young Farmers**

We have been very busy this month. We started off the month with a social with Alberbury and Shawbury young farmers playing bubble football on the Rushbury Millennium Green. Later in the month, we went on a tour around Laura's Delicious Dairy which produces ice cream just outside Ludlow. It was fantastic to see how the ice cream is made and have a look around her dairy farm. We all got to try different flavours. # LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR AUGUST

Many churches have risen to the challenge of welcoming Ukrainian refugees. By the time you read this I hope we will have a family of five staying with us – visas permitting! We have been greatly helped by a support hub organised by the team at St. Peter's in Hereford. We won't have the time to help our guests with the labyrinthine procedures of registration, school places and the like. Fortunately, being part of the group means we can provide what we can and others will help them settle in.

A few weeks ago, some of the recently arrived guests reflected on the cultural differences they had encountered as they settled in. Notable was their bemusement about how English people say sorry all the time. Its true, we do! American friends find it odd as well. Ukrainians tend to be much more direct. Identifying these cultural differences reveals a lot about our different expectations. They can misinterpret our behaviour as insincere; we can interpret theirs as impolite. Both are misinterpretations, but clarifying these expectations is important.

This plays out in every sphere of life: school, home, community and Church. So much conflict could be avoided if we had the courage to have honest conversations about the effect the behaviour of others has on us, particularly in an environment where we decide we aren't going to take offence. Jesus' disciples' expectations of what a messiah would look like were completely wrong. Much of his ministry was about putting them right. The expectations of our clergy have often been formed in a completely different environment to now. One deanery in our diocese has 7 stipendiary clergy. In 1961 there were 17! Clearly, the current generation can't do the things their predecessors did. Similarly, some clergy's expectations of the people in the parishes may have been formed in a very different context to the multi-parish setting in which they now serve.

Many of the relational problems that naturally emerge in any community, and especially in churches, trace back to this expectation mismatch.

As we move forward as a diocese post-COVID these sorts of honest conversations will be vital to the health and well-being of the church. Listening to one another in order to understand rather than to respond will be a key element. Healthy communities are ones that identify conflict and move towards it to resolve it rather than avoid it and pretend it isn't there. I believe a church community that models handling disagreements well could be a very attractive one in a fragmented world like ours.

# Lightbulb moments at Youth Conference

Young people from south Shropshire worked together with local decision makers to make change happen at the Youth Conference South Shropshire on Saturday 25 June.

The free event brought young people from all over the area together to talk to Town, Parish & County Councillors and other leaders in a relaxed atmosphere about what they want, need, like where they live. More than 50 people attended the event at Shropshire Hills Discovery Centre in Craven Arms, including Town Council representatives from Ludlow, Bishop's Castle, Clun with Chapel Lawn, Craven Arms and Broseley.

Half of the organising team were under 25 and they put together an interactive programme that included campaign t-shirt making, podcast production, and intergenerational conversations about activism and local action. On the day attendees created a number of action plans. These included working on youth drop-in sessions in Bishop's Castle and installing a skate bowl in Craven Arms.

Marinke Fontein, Infrastructure Support Officer with South Shropshire Youth Network (SSYN), says: "It was good to see so many Councillors and representatives of organisations such as the Islamic Centre in Craven Arms, Healthwatch Shropshire, South Shropshire Climate Action, and the Office of Police & Crime Commis-



sioner actively engage with young people, building big change by making small steps."

Participants were asked to pledge to take action around a specific issue. The pledge commitment could be big or small, for example, sending an email, making a phone call, or talking to friends about an issue. SSYN will follow the pledges up in autumn and will work with local communities to help push things forwards.

Marinke adds: "We also asked people to record their lightbulb moment of the day. Here's one: 'Young people are ready to think about the needs of other groups alongside their own.' To me that sums up how important intergenerational conversations are.'

# Langues - de - chat

### "What?" That's French for 'Cat's tongues' – otherwise known, in a slightly different shape, as Barmouth biscuits'.

Coming out of war lots of food was still rationed, and I think families had to be registered for their shopping. At our family grocers I would be sat down on I (it seemed to me then) a very tall chair by the counter as my mother's order was dealt with, and lovely Mr. Lloyd would give me broken biscuits to eat! (I suppose they couldn't be sold). Then all the groceries were put into the bottom of my little sister's pram, the floor put back and off we went home.

When biscuits eventually came 'off ration' these were the ones that imprinted themselves on my child's mind. They are delicious!

As the years went by they disappeared from the shelves - maybe not commercial and certainly with a tricky shelf life as they are rather fragile - so I was delighted a few months ago to find this recipe, but in French.

### Here it is, translated for you.

### Barmouth biscuits (makes about 20-25 biscuits)

2 egg whites 100g sugar 60g flour 60g melted butter Pinch of salt Oven 120C; baking trays covered with silicone baking paper.

Beat the egg whites rapidly with a fork, then tip in the sugar, the flour, the butter, and a pinch of salt. Mix together.

Drop spoonfuls on to the prepared baking trays, allowing room for spreading (experience will tell you how much!)

Bake for about 8-10 minutes, until they are golden brown round the edges.
